2. Changes in a program of instruction (POI) and course
administrative data (CAD) that require increased resources (i.e.,
course growth) will be approved by this headquarters. Commandants
retain approval authority for course changes that do not require
additional resources. However, submit POIs/CADs through the
appropriate major subordinate command to the DCSOPS&T for approval.

3. "Course growth" encompasses any changes in training strategy that
increase requirements for personnel, time, equipment, or funding.
More resources may be required to ensure a viable, relevant training
base as the Army transforms. However, we also must balance the need
to transform our training against living within our means. Your
continued assistance in this effort is essential to our overall
success.
